Crane accident kills Maldives port workers

Two stevedores in the port of Male, Maldives, were killed on Monday night when a crane cable snapped while lifting a container, local sources have reported. A piece of metal from the crane flew off and struck the men as they were unloading Vietnamflagged Morning Viship. Mohamed Nashid, who suffered severe head injuries, died before reaching hospital, and Ibrahim Shareef died at the hospital. Both were employees of Maldives Ports Limited (MPL). A third MPL man on the ship was slightly injured by metal fragments and the crane operator collapsed with shock. The 6,251gt Viship-owned geared container ship had arrived the same day from Colombo, Sri Lanka, and is a regular visitor to the port.
