



4 Argentine terminals paralyzed after death of port worker

Pedro Fita, 27, had been hospitalized at Los Alerces Sanatorium, where at noon his death was announced. Due to that fact, the Union United Argentine Ports launched a strike of 24 hours from the zero hour of Monday. A glass windshield detached itself from a crane and fell on Fita's head piercing his helmet, which produced brain death. In addition, due to the impact another worker suffered severe multiple trauma of the skull and other injuries, although he is out of danger. His life was not at risk, according to the account provided by his relatives.

SUPA's secretary general, Cesar Aybar, clarified that the stoppage of activities will include the terminals of Rosario, Arroyo Seco, Alvear and Villa Gobernador Gálvez.
