

Accident in the Port: an operator died and there is labor walkout in 4 terminals



One of the workers who suffered serious injuries last Thursday in Terminal Puerto Rosario, when a large glass fell on his head, died Sunday. From the Unión Unidos Portuarios Union, they launched a 24-hour force measure. The concessionary company investigates.

The operator of the Puerto Rosario Terminal that suffered severe injuries last Thursday, when a large glass fell on his head, died Sunday at noon. Another worker was also injured. Due to the fact, from the Union United Argentine Ports launched a strike of 24 hours from the zero hour of Monday.

According to information provided by relatives to Rosario3.com, Pedro Fita, 27, died at noon on Sunday. Last Thursday, a large glass was detached from a crane and dropped to pierce his helmet.

The victim - who was to be a father in the next few months - was admitted to Los Alerces Sanatorium, where he was diagnosed with brain death.

The accident left a second worker injured. He suffered head trauma and cuts. He was admitted to intensive care. His life was not at risk, according to the story of his relatives.

Due to the tragic event, the United Port Workers Union (Supa) launched a strike at the terminals of Rosario, Villa Gobernador Gálvez, Arroyo Seco and Alvear.

Meanwhile, Terminal Puerto Rosario expressed in a statement "his deep regret" and his willingness to accompany the family of the deceased worker, while informing that they are carrying out the necessary investigations to determine the cause of this tragic fact.
